Playing to Learn

I recently read an article about the science of play. In the past few decades, more information has been discovered about what children learn when they play, and that this thing they like to do is actually something they need to do. The United Nations even recognizes play as a "fundamental human right." When a child is safely supervised, yet allowed to play freely, he/she is learning to think creatively and with flexibility. This in turn is building a foundation for adaptation to challenges that may be faced later in life.

When children play together with other children or parents, so much is being learned about social interaction and relationships. If a parent can allow a child the time and space to work out a problem on his/her own, that child is benefiting by practicing negotiations and conflict resolution. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics' Council on School Health in 2013, "safe and well-supervised recess offers cognitive, social, emotional, and physical benefits..." Providing the time and place for children to play and have fun when away from school and screens will benefit them both now and in the future. So when in doubt, let them play.


